

Artwork FAQs

Thank you so much for considering an artwork donation to our new fundraising event, called “Home Is Where the Art Is”. As we launch this event we want to answer as many questions as possible.

- **When and where is it?**

“Home Is Where the Art Is” will be held from 5:30-8:00pm on Thursday, August 16th, 2018 at George Williams College in Williams Bay.



- **What does it cost to participate?**

When you donate a piece of art, we are happy to also provide you with a complimentary ticket to the event. Tickets are normally \$40 in advance and \$50 at the door. Attendance is not mandatory for artists. We also have sponsorships available.

- **What happens to the money raised at the event?**

All proceeds from the event go directly to Twin Oaks Shelter for the Homeless, Walworth County's only 24/7 shelter for families. All donations, including artwork, are tax deductible to the extent allowed by law.

- **How will the artwork be sold?**

We plan to have a firm purchase price for each piece, so we ask that you price it accordingly on the donation form. We are also planning a silent auction showcase of works created by Twin Oaks residents.

- **What kind of donations are you seeking?**

As long as it is produced by an artist from our region, we are open to a variety of media and styles. We ask that artwork not depict violence or other activities that may conflict with the mission of our organization.

- **How will it be displayed?**

We plan to use a mix of partitions, easels and tables to display the works. The space will have a lot of nooks so our guests can take their time discovering artwork.

- **How will the artwork be transported?**

We'll arrange delivery to Twin Oaks/Community Action beforehand. We plan to set up the morning of August 16. Artwork will be released to buyers after the event, so all guests may enjoy the art throughout the evening.

- **Will there be food?**

Saving the most important question for last! Yes, we'll have heavy appetizers and cash bar.
